Community Garden – Patsy Drummond, Project Coordinator, Health Department

It's really hot, like really, really hot...and dry. The past couple weeks have been spent trying to keep all the plants alive through this unseasonably hot and dry weather. I've been in the garden every morning 8am to Lunch focusing on watering everything. I've also been weeding, since the weeds seem to thrive no matter the weather! If you visit the garden in the evenings and/or weekends please feel free to water anything! I have set-up dedicated handheld water sprayers in the greenhouse and the main garden area. There are also sprinklers for each field area. Every little bit helps, thank-you!

The Peach tree is struggling in the heat and intense sun. I've arrived a few times to the greenhouse to find it all closed up...one morning it was 40 degrees at 8am! I've removed the handles for the side panels and have tied the doors open. A goal for the near future is to have a power line put into the lot so we can access electricity and hook up a fan for better ventilation (among other things) for the greenhouse.

Have definitely seen the effect of the intense and prolonged heat on plants: the strawberries are ripe, but very small. The peas are half the size as they were at this time last year.

I've harvested all the mature radishes and garlic scapes and delivered to those in community who requested. The garlic will be ready to be harvested in about 2 weeks time.

On Wednesday, August 25, 2021 & Wednesday September 1, 2021, Toby will not be on site, she will be taking telehealth appointments over the phone.


On site clinics will resume in person on Wednesday, September 8, 2021.

Wildfire Preparedness

The wildfire danger rating (i.e. the risk of a wildfire starting) in BC is high to extreme across most of the province. Although we cannot predict where a wildfire will occur or when, we can be proactive and take steps to prepare ourselves and protect our properties from being damaged by a wildfire.



Make an Emergency Plan

Ensure your family knows what to do in an emergency. Use the "Get Prepared" website to create an emergency plan for your family and home. Creating and printing the on-line plan will only take you about 20 minutes. https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/safety/emergency-preparedness-response-recovery/preparedbc/make-your-plan

2. Emergency Preparedness Kits - "Grab and Go Bags"

In an emergency, it is important to have some supplies in case you need to get by without power or running water. Most emergency organizations recommend that you are prepared to be self-sufficient for at least 72 hours. Make a grab and go bag for your pets.

Basic Emergency Kit Checklist

- · Pen and notepad
- Phone charger and battery bank
- Flashlight wind up or battery powered (and extra batteries)
- Radio wind up or battery powered (and extra batteries)
- First aid kit
- Personal toiletries and medication
- Seasonal clothing
- Food = non-perishable such as energy bars, dried and canned food; manual can opener
- Water = at least two litres of water per person per day
- Extra keys for car and house



SALMON SEASON 2021

FORECAST

THE 2021 PRE-SEASON FORECAST FOR SOCKEYE SALMON SUGGESTS A 90% CHANCE THAT 679,000 FISH WILL RETURN TO THE SKEENA RIVER. THIS IS 70% ABOVE THE CONSERVATION TARGET OF 400,000.

NO FOOD FISHING CLOSURES ARE BEING CONSIDERED RIGHT NOW. IF THIS CHANGES, AN ANNOUNCEMENT WILL BE POSTED IN TSUNYOW: WHERE KITSELAS CONNECTS, AND ON THE ADMINISTRATION FACEBOOK PAGE.

While Out Food Fishing

The Kitselas Lands and Resources Department (KLRD) is responsible for food fish monitoring to ensure ongoing and sustainable use of the Traditional Territory's lands and waters. Help support our work by remembering to:

— Have your band membership card or your food fish permit with you at all times while fishing. Due to COVID-19 office closures, new food fish permits will not be issued this year. If you lost your food fish permit, use your band membership card.


— Be mindful to not fish in one spot for more
than 48 consecutive hours from Sunday to Saturday
so that others have access to fishing sites.

IMPORTANT

In 2019, when returns were very low, some fishers left nets in for long periods of time without checking them. Fish in these nets were dead and rotten when pulled. This year, food fish monitors will be pulling nets that do not have a name and phone number on them and are left unattended. If you do not put your name and number on your net you must remain with your net the entire time it is in the water. If a net is pulled it will be left on the rocks/beach and the fish will be donated to elders in the community.

Did You Know?

This year, Wai Wah Environmental field staff will be doing the food fish monitoring. You can expect them to ask the same questions KLRD staff members asked in the past.

Wai Wah Environmental is a fully Kistelas-owned environmental services company. Wai Wah was formed, in partnership with Kitselas Nation, with a keen sense of stewardship and a desire to develop Kitselas Traditional Territory in harmony with the values and vision of the Kitselas people who live here. Wai Wah and KLRD have a close relationship in the delivery of KLRD's stewardship programs.


We have a very passionate Membership that comes together for these land use planning initiatives which aim to enhance quality of life for our people by balancing economic, social, cultural, and environmental values.
