Kitselas Community,

On Tuesday, July 5, 2022, crews from K5T start treatment work for our FireSmart program in the Gitaus subdivision, which will take place over a few weeks. The crews will be working along the Priority Zone 3 boundary line of lots (backyard) 100 metres towards the Gitaus reserve boundary area and will be using power tools to thin, prune, and remove vegetation.

Taking FireSmart Actions in Zone 3 will reduce wildfire risk to homes in our community. Taking opportunities to manage vegetation and create a firebreak by creating space between trees and other flammable vegetation in Zone 3 will change the dynamics of wildfire behaviour.






2. Register on the app - band membership number is needed to do this
