We are happy to announce that Kitselas Head Start (Preschool) is now Kitselas Head Start & Day Care which will be providing Daycare.

Anne has always had the focus on having a Daycare for our growing families as we see the Parents endure their Education, work, and training. she had an opportunity to apply for Funding that gave Kitselas to provide a no cost Daycare to parents.

This is available to children on reserve ages 2.5 years old (2 spots) – 5 years old of age not entered Kindergarten (14 spots). After all children on reserve has applied, we invite children off reserve.

Transportation is only offered on reserve for pick up and drop off.

The Health Director, Band Manager and Staff have been working hard to make this available very soon; we are looking opening as Daycare in September 2022: we currently hiring staff and making adjustments to center/supplies for additional enrollment and staff.

Approximately 60 community members attended the event, ages 10+. Twenty of those attendees were K5T employees/students.

Each person who attended received a sweater from Mike Scott's clothing line.

It was a great turn out.









Kitselas Leadership/Culture camp 2022

This year was another great year at our annual culture camp, we also included a leadership camp this year to teach some leadership skills for the older youth to assist us with the younger youth. We partnered this year with UNBC/NIFCS/Kitselas treaty to offer our youth some cultural activities and some leadership and scientific activities.

First week started July 4-8th

This was our leadership camp for youth ages 12 and up, we had a total of 15 older registered youth that participated in this week long training, our week included a visit to Stan Bevans carving shed/Treaty simulation with BCTC/Training with UNBC/Kayaking and a tour of our Forest Garden with Patsy and Chelsea. We also had the opportunity to listen our elders Isabelle Mckee and Ken Mcdames Sr. talk about some history of Kitselas.

Second week July 11-15th

This was the start of our culture camp for youth ages 6-11, for this camp we had a total of 22 youth registered, bringing our total amount of youth up to 37 as we combined our leadership camp. We had the opportunity to work with UNBC this week, some of the activities included:

Harvesting raspberries and learning how to jar (Nutritional Science)

3 science experiments (Biochemistry Science)

Toured community garden and community smokehouses

Traditional art classes with Sierra Spencer

Toured traditional Kitselas lands at Ferry Island and learned about its history

Spent the day at lakelse lake

Third week July 18th – 22nd

Our last week of camp included a trip to the Nisga'a Museum in Laxgalstap, we also made a stop at Gitwinksihlkw to visit the walking bridge. During the week we also harvest more raspberries and blueberries, and did more traditional art work. We had the opportunity to teach them some outdoor survival skills that included what to do in the event you find yourself lost in the woods, like staying in one spot and building a shelter in case you have to stay overnight. We ended our camp with a day at the Lakelse lake, the kids really enjoyed themselves and are already asking about next year and what we can do.

It was a difficult month for our community, we had many deaths in the community, we did our best to keep our programs going and took the time to educate our youth on what our cultural protocols are when someone passes away in the community, we had moments of silence and made some grief counsellors available to those youth who needed to talk to someone.

I would also like to mention that we took our 13u boys youth basketball team to a tournament in Gitlaxdaamix July 8-9th, they played 4 games in two days and came in 3rd, I am very proud of our teams this year and cant wait until next basketball season.

Bill C-92 Information Sheet

Bill C-92 - An Act respecting First Nations, Inuit and Métis children, youth and families is an Act to affirm and recognize First Nations jurisdiction over child and family services. It came into force on January 1, 2020.

Northwest Inter-Nation Family Community Services Society (NIFCS) is an Aboriginal based agency that provides family support, guardianship, and caregiver services to seven First Nations communities in the Northwest region of British Columbia. Our member communities are: Kitselas, Haisla Nation, Lax Kw'alaams Band, Gitxaala Nation, Gitga'at Nation, Kitsumkalum Indian Band, and Metlakatla First Nation.

In 2021, NIFCS applied for funding under the Community Well Being Jurisdiction Initiative (CWJI). The Community Well-Being and Jurisdiction Initiatives Program funding is targeted to First Nation communities to lead, develop and deliver prevention programs and services that:

- · are culturally appropriate
- · are in keeping with the best interests of the child, as determined by the community
- support First Nations capacity in child and family well-being

NIFCS goal is to support our communities in the ongoing dialogue on the *Act respecting First Nations, Inuit, and Métis Children, Youth and Families*. With the CWJI Program Funding, NIFCS has contracted Community Liaison Officers from July 11, 2022 to September 30, 2022 to increase engagement, provide more awareness of Bill C-92 as well as gather input and feedback.

While this initial engagement for some communities may require a reflection on how the community historically took care of their children and families, it is also an opportunity for each community to provide feedback on the direction of childcare in the future.

One of the NIFCS communities, Lax Kw'alaams Band, has undertaken prevention utilizing the Na Gan Ts'i'stk Grandmother's Group. The Grandmothers Group are already taking steps to care for their children and families. Lax Kw'alaams Band has an existing framework and may want to dialogue on how it will enact their own laws and jurisdiction.

NIFCS would like our member communities to work together and explore options. The Community Liaison Officers will be engaging with their respective community to speak one-on-one or with groups to dialogue and engage. The Community Liaison Officers are as follows:

NIFCS respects and acknowledges that we are not the rights holders, but with over 20 years of sharing and collaborating with our member communities, we believe we can offer value when it comes to exploring future opportunities with respect to children, youth, and families. Under the child welfare legislation, we see an opportunity to support the elected leadership and others the elected leadership would like to engage with such as Hereditary Chiefs, Elders, knowledge holders, families, and youth to move this work forward in a good way.
