We all supported the housing development completion of the three Duplexes to the current forty units under construction. This Council approved the loan of a member with RBC to independently build their own home on reserve. This loan is available to all Kitselas members.

When I attend conferences on behalf of Kitselas I always speak up & express my concerns when it comes to economic development, joint ventures, employment opportunities for Kitselas members.

We don't just want the entry level employment, janitorial, Security, cooks. We want to our members to have the opportunity to be trained for the higher employment opportunities.

It's important to speak up especially when it comes to Kitselas Traditional Territory which extends all the way up to Legate Creek down to the mouth of the Skeena River. Port Essington.

Kitselas needs to explore business development for the Airport Lands.


Kitselas needs to promote selective fisheries using the fishwheel in Kitselas Canyon. The salmon that is harvested can be given to the elders & sold if a Commercial fishing license is issued by DFO.

I strongly support Kitselas membership being hired for employment opportunities within the Administration.

I look at what Kitselas has accomplished in our two-year term – I would like to see more community development continue for Gitaus;

- -A convenient/gas bar (awaiting a feasibility study)
- -K5T understands the importance of relocating back to Gitaus
- -Kitselas Canyon Park development. Several years ago, Kitselas Band Council set aside \$300,000.00 to go toward the Kitselas Canyon from a specific claim settlement.
- -Old Kitselas Cemetery property maintained and possibly expanded to allow additional grave plots.
- -Marine Resource Harvesting is important for Kitselas to have an ocean vessel to give Kitselas members access to resources such as seaweed, clams, and cockles. Conclude IMBA Port of Prince Rupert.
- -The Canadian National Railway (CN) needs to compensate for Kitselas Indian Reserve IR #1, 2 & 4.
- -Community Fund set up to assist our members for funeral expenses and to have a Kitselas pension plan for Kitselas elders 65 & older.
- -Kitselas's Governance and HR should be reviewed and updated to reflect Kitselas's Administration & political body.
- -Kitselas should consider land acquisition for promoting Kitselas' history to Lakelse Lake.
- -Forestry tenure acquisition to add to existing 43K Cu.
- -Supporting KDC/KFP in the defending a lawsuit with respect to issues that arose from KDC, with the support of the previous council retaining Teare Creek Contracting Ltd. to clear the airport lands and later a portion of Onion Lake lands. The first issue that Teare Creek cleared past the boundaries of the airport lands and illegally cleared lands that are owed by the City of Terrace, which KDC was obligated to restore. The second issue is that Teare Creek logged more lands than were authorized and contrary to forestry practices. Teare Creek has sued claiming that they are owed monies for the clearing of the Airport Lands. KDC has counterclaimed for the damages that it has suffered as a result of the illegal clearing of lands owned by the City of Terrace, for over charging and for damages regarding the Onion Lake lands, including the fact that KDC received no revenue from any of the clearing that was done.
- -Community Hall was identified in the community comprehensive plan and is currently being constructed.

I want to wish all candidates the best of luck in Kitselas June 12th Band Council Election.

ON THE COAST I AM KILLERWHALE; INLAND MY CREST IS GROUSE/FIREWEED. I HAVE TAKEN SM'ALGYK CLASSES TO LEARN THE KITSELAS DIALECT FROM ISABELLE. I COMPLETED AN INTRODUCTION TO NORTHWEST COAST FORM LINE FROM ARLENE NESS. RECENTLY, I WROTE, FILMED, AND EDITED MY FIRST SHORT FILM "THE FOREST GARDENS OF KITSELAS CANYON" THROUGH EMPOWERED FILMMAKERS, IN PARTNERSHIP WITH TELUS AND STORYHIVE. I ENCOURAGE EVERYONE TO BECOME INVOLVED IN LEARNING OUR LANGUAGE, HISTORY, AND ART - THESE ARE SOME OF THE VALUABLE PIECES OF CULTURE WE CAN LEARN AND PASS ON.

FOR MANY YEARS I HAVE BEEN A MEMBER OF THE FINANCE AND AUDIT COMMITTEE TO SERVE THE INTERESTS OF THE KITSELAS NATION.

I SERVED TWO TERMS ON COUNCIL DURING A TIME OF INDUSTRIAL UPSWING THAT SAW MILLIONS OF DOLLARS OF OWN SOURCE REVENUE FLOW TO THE KITSELAS NATION FROM CGL, PROVINCIAL AND FEDERAL GOVERNMENT.

I UNDERSTAND KITSELAS LAWS AND POLICIES, THE ROLE OF CHIEF AND COUNCIL, THE FINANCES OF THE NATION, AS WELL THE WORK BEING CARRIED OUT IN THE KITSELAS TERRITORY. I HAVE KEPT IN TOUCH WITH OUR LIMITED PARTNERSHIPS TO UNDERSTAND THE SUCCESSES AND CHALLENGES THEY HAVE HAD.

I BELIEVE IT IS IMPORTANT THAT OUR MEMBERS CAN MAKE AN INFORMED DECISION REGARDING THE TREATY VOTE. I HAVE ATTENDED THE TREATY MEETINGS AND DR TRY AND THE TREATY TEAM HAVE DONE AN EXCELLENT JOB OF EXPLAINING, CONNECTING, AND INFORMING.

IN COMMUNITY MEETINGS I HAVE TALKED ABOUT THE IMPORTANCE OF FINISHING THE OWN SOURCE REVENUE POLICY. WHEN THIS CONSULTATION STOPPED IN 2019, THERE WAS A LOT OF INTEREST IN FORMING AN KITSELAS TRUST FUND TO SEPARATE THE OWN SOURCE REVENUE FROM THE ADMINISTRATION. OWN SOURCE REVENUE BELONGS TO EACH MEMBER OF KITSELAS, AND IT IS THE KITSELAS MEMBERS WHO WILL DECIDE WHAT THEY WILL DO WITH THEIR FUNDS.

THERE ARE CONCERNS WITH THE GITAUS RECREATION CENTRE LACK OF FEASIBILITY AND BUSINESS PLAN. I WILL WORK VERY HARD WITH ALL STAKEHOLDERS TO DEVELOP THESE KEY PIECES OF INFORMATION, AND COMPILE THE INCOME EXPECTATIONS FROM ACTIVITIES AT THE RECREATION CENTRE. THERE WAS NEVER ANY DOUBT OF THE NEED FOR A RECREATION CENTER IN GITAUS, BUT NOT BY LEAVING A LEGACY OF DEBT. WE CAN FIX THIS. THERE ARE ALSO SERIOUS CONCERNS WITH THE DRUG EPIDEMIC, THE IMMEDIATE NEED TO HIRE A CAO, AND THE NEED TO CLEARLY AND LEGALLY DEFINE THE "ARM'S LENGTH RELATIONSHIP" BETWEEN CHIEF AND COUNCIL AND OUR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ENTITIES.

I BELIEVE WE ARE STRONGER TOGETHER, AND WILL WORK FOR THE NATION. THERE'S A LOT OF WORK TO DO, AND WE'RE GOING TO HIT THE FLOOR RUNNING. WAI WAH!!

On June 12, 2023, elect: H. Lloyd McDames as your Kitselas Representative.



I have my diploma in Business Administration. I have a collection of training and experience on Council, the band administration policies and procedures, the LNG sector, or-



Bear Safety in Our Communities

FORECAST

GRIZZLY AND BLACK BEARS ARE ACTIVE IN KITSELAS TERRITIORY, AND CAN BE DANGEROUS IF THEY COME INTO OUR COMMUNITIES. IT IS IMPORTANT WE ALL MAKE EFFORTS TO NOT ATTRACT BEARS.

Being Bear Aware

Spring has arrived, and so have the bears. At this time of year, bears typically feed on natural food sources such as grasses, sedges, and skunk cabbage. Unfortunately, some bears that accessed garbage and other materials last season may return as they have learned these areas can be easy sources of food.

If you're spending time outside, always be on the lookout for bears or signs that they are in the area. You should not assume that if you've never had a bear visit previously that you will not have one in the future. While bears usually prefer to avoid human activity and feed on natural foods, they are often drawn in by the smell of potential food sources in our communities.

To ensure bears don't come sniffing around the community, we all need to keep all fragrant materials locked and stored away securely. Garbage, food waste, and other fragrant materials left outside and accessible WILL attract bears to the community.



KITSELAS LANDS AND RESOURCES DEPARTMENT UPDATE



- Remember that most bears just want to be
- Identify yourself so the bear knows you are a human, and not prey.
- Pick up small children.
- Do not run bears are like dogs in that they will chase fleeing animals
- Speak calmly and in a low voice. Do not scream or make sudden movements.
- Back away slowly and calmly.

When it is safe to do so, call the BC Conservation Officer Service (24 hours) at 1-877-952-7277 (RAPP) or text #7277 to report your encounter.

Did You Know?

Grizzly bears travel widely, with female grizzlies in BC making their home ranges over 50-400 km2 and with males having much larger home ranges of between 500-2,000 km2 - almost as long as the distance between Terrace and Winnipeg (2,184 km)!
