

Job Description: Program Coordinator

The Gitselasu Stewardship Society (GSS) is pleased to announce the position of **Program Coordinator** with a starting date in Winter 2024. The Program Coordinator directly reports to the General Manager and supports day-to-day operation of the Canyon through various administrative and inter-personal tasks.

The GSS is an Indigenous-governed, non-profit organization dedicated to the protection and responsible development of Kitselas Canyon, a regionally significant cultural tourism destination. The GSS is accountable to the Kitselas community and makes management decisions according to Kitselas values.

Responsibilities of the Program Coordinator include fulfilling administrative tasks, scheduling and supervising seasonal staff, scheduling Canyon group tours, planning events, ordering and maintaining supplies, supporting grant applications, and other tasks. The Coordinator is a member of the on-site team helping with day-to-day operations.

Work is located seasonally (May-Sept) on site at Kitselas Canyon and at the GSS office space in the Kitselas Lands & Resources building in the off season (Oct-Apr).

Requirements:

- Minimum of three years of relevant work experience
- Driver's licence
- Strong computer skills (Microsoft Word and Excel, email, Zoom, etc.)
- Positive, team-oriented attitude
- Strong customer service orientation
- Ability to self-manage and complete work in dynamic environment
- Interest in Kitselas history and/or traditional culture

Optional, valuable assets:

- Occupational First Aid Level 1 or higher
- Other relevant work-related certifications and skills (e.g., accounting, sales, communications, job safety, museum work, outdoor recreation, etc.)





Connecting our Community

Who is Kitselas Five Tier System (K5T)?

K5T is a community-built, social enterprise promoting job and skills training and holistic employment services for First Nations People and Newcomers within Northwest BC. The organization was formed in October 2020 as the operational arm of Kitselas Employment and Training (KET), overseen by the Kitselas Socio-Economic Development Corporation (KSEDC). K5T operates at arms-length from Kitselas First Nation (KFN) Administration.

What's going on at the K5T Clubhouse?

As many of you know, the Kitselas Five Tier System (K5T) Education and Training Centre is located at 4404 Queensway Drive in Thornhill. What you might not know is that K5T will soon be expanding into the neighbouring property with an exciting new project; the K5T Education Village. K5T was able to make this happen with the help of Kitselas Community Land GP Ltd., the purchaser of the neighbouring 4480 Queensway Drive property. Kitselas Community Land GP Ltd. will soon be leasing this property to K5T to allow us to better support the Kitselas community and the region through the development of temporary student housing and long-term comprehensive Education Village further explained below.

Live, learn, play: Welcome to the Kulspai Education Village

The Kulspai Education Village is one of the first Indigenous co-housing and learning environments of its kind that will support students, workers, and Elders to live in a sustainable and connected way. With the help of a team of professional land use planners, engineers, and architects, K5T is working for and with the Kitselas community to develop an inclusive, intentional, and healthy community-oriented space to live, learn, and play.

K5T's purpose is to strengthen our community by improving quality of life for Kitselas Members and others within our region through supported education, skills training, and connections to meaningful employment. The Kulspai Education Village will expand K5T programs and related supports, such as housing, childcare, wellness, and recreation.

Location: A culturally significant place



Queensway Drive, on the unceded traditional Ts'msyen (Tsimshian) territories of the Kitselas First Nation.


Easy access to nearby Kulspai Indian Reserve No. 6, Thornhill, and the greater Terrace area.

With the growth of KSEDC in recent years - we are looking for a unique visual expression and appropriate branding to capture the values and good work of the organization.


